DESCRIPTION

Lutheran North is a college preparatory high school, grades 9-12, located in Macomb, Michigan. CURRICULUM

The academic program is a college-prep curriculum organized on a semester-based, eight period daily schedule. Class periods meet for 45 minutes each day, and all students take 7 or 8 credits per year.

RANK

Rank in class includes all semester grades from all courses for grades 9-12. The ranking is based on the weighted cumulative GPA. Honors courses will be weighted an additional 0.5 (i.e. A is worth 4.5, a B is worth 3.5, etc.), and Advanced Placement courses will be weighted an additional 1.0 (i.e. A is worth 5.0, a B is worth 4.0, etc.).

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

There are 28 credits required to graduate (24 credits plus ½ credit of Religion for each semester in attendance). 1 credit is 1 year. The minimum credits required for graduation are:
