

NOAH PROJECT

Give serious thought and prayer to your NOAH projects. The 20 hours must be served for a non-profit organization. The first place to serve hours is at your home church. Community Service Organizations are other choices and are listed on the back of this form. When you have selected a volunteer project, fill in your name, grade, location of the project, and write a brief description in the space provided below. Upon finishing the project, have the coordinator/supervisor fill in the hours you worked, provide a phone number where the person can be reached, and sign it. Place the completed form in the NOAH box in the school office. If you have any questions about what are considered NOAH hours, please check with Mr. Reincke who has the final decision in accepting NOAH hours.

PLEASE NOTE: Things NOT considered as NOAH hours:

- > things done for family, friends, or neighbors such as snow shoveling, lawn care, moving, etc.
- babysitting for family, friends, neighbors, etc.
- > hours served at a for-profit or family-owned business even though payment is not received

Students may not serve NOAH hours during a school day that LHN is in session. Student council, NHS and HOSA service hours are separate from NOAH service hours. NOAH hours are 20 per calendar school year. Students can begin earning for the following school year when the current school year is completed.

<u>NOAH PROJECT</u>

What is NOAH?

NOAH is an acronym for North's Organization in Assisting Humanity. It is an opportunity for students to let their light shine outside of Lutheran North - an opportunity to reach out and help where help is needed - an opportunity to witness and share the love of Jesus.

What is the objective?

Each student is required to serve at least 20 hours each year (or 10 hours for each semester enrolled at Lutheran North), for a not-for-profit organization.

Where to volunteer?

Your home congregation should be your first choice for serving NOAH hours. Help is always needed with VBS, Sunday School, ushering and the like on Sunday mornings. Mission trips sponsored by your church, using your musical talents at worship, participating in Youth Group service activities and volunteering for office and maintenance related chores are also acceptable areas of service.

If your church has a school, offering help to teachers with classroom projects, tutoring and the like are acceptable. Students **may not** serve NOAH hours during a school day LHN is in session. Student council and NHS activities are separate from NOAH service hours.

Community service organizations are also a way to serve. Food pantries, McRest Shelter, Salvation Army, nursing homes, libraries and hospitals are places that may welcome your service.

Hours are NOT accepted for things done for family, friends or neighbors such as:

- Snow shoveling, lawn care, moving, etc.
- Babysitting for family, friends or neighbors.
- Hours served for a for-profit business even if payment is not received.

When to Volunteer

The best time to serve your NOAH hours is in the summer before the upcoming school year. Your hours are to be finished before your next school year starts as a 10th, 11th or 12th grader. Your schedule will be withheld if hours are not completed. Senior NOAH hours must be completed in May before graduation in order to receive a diploma.

Your NOAH hours should be a rewarding experience for you and the recipient. Take advantage of the many opportunities to serve those who need an ARK – **A**ct of **R**andom **K**indness!
